



## Round 1: Open House

During our first round, you'll have the opportunity to explore magazines from all 14 chapters. These magazines will be available on Canvas under the 'Chapter Magazines' tab within the module. This module will open early August, giving you a few days to review all the information before we meet.

Additionally, do you remember us mentioning a video? This video should include a brief introduction along with responses to a set of questions. For details on how to create and submit your video, visit page 12. Our chapters will use these videos to get to know you better!

After creating your video and reviewing all 14 magazines, you will preference the chapters during Virtual Convocation with your Recruitment Guide.

A tip from the Vice President of Recruitment Operations: Remember, Recruitment is all about finding your home—a place where you feel truly comfortable, supported, and empowered. While the chapter magazines are beautifully designed, don't let the aesthetics alone guide your decision. Instead, focus on how each chapter's values, stories, and sisterhood make you feel. Pay attention to what speaks to your heart and where you can see yourself growing and thriving. At the end of the day, it's not about the prettiest pages—it's about the connections you make and the sisterhood that feels like home!













## Round 2: Philanthropy

Welcome to your first day of meeting our chapters! Today marks the exciting start of your journey to discover what makes each of our chapters truly special—philanthropy. During the next two days, you will receive a schedule that invites you to visit different chapters and learn about how their chapter supports and raises awareness for their philanthropic causes.

Be ready to share! We encourage you to talk about any community service projects you have participated in or are currently involved with. Today is also the perfect opportunity to express what you are passionate about, as our chapters will be doing the same.

If you have any questions or need assistance, your Recruitment Guides are here to help, so don't hesitate to connect with them. Get ready to connect, learn, and be inspired.

A tip from your Vice President of Recruitment Operations: Take notes throughout the Philanthropy Round! With multiple chapters spread across different days, it can be easy to forget details. Writing down your thoughts on each chapter's philanthropy, values, and conversations will be incredibly helpful when it's time to make your selections.













## Round 3: Sisterhood

During this round, you will have the chance to connect more deeply with members and hear personal stories about their sorority experience and what makes their chapter feel like home. You will also take part in a special ceremony that is unique to each chapter, giving you a glimpse into the traditions that strengthen their bonds of sisterhood.

This round can be emotional for some women as they reflect on the friendships and memories they have built within their chapter. But remember, it's okay if you don't feel emotional—everyone experiences this moment in their own way.

## Round 4: Preservence

### Round 1 Video tips, tricks and everything in-between

The first round of Panhellenic recruitment is entirely virtual! You will upload a 3 minute video through Campus Director (where you registered for formal recruitment). You do not need to upload a video to complete your registration, but a video is required to be submitted by August 1!

#### WHAT'S IN MY VIDEO?

In a video that is approximately 3 minutes, please answer the following *required* guestions:

- Introduction- name, major, year, hometown/high school and any other information you would like to share!
- Why do you want to join a sorority?
- What does your high school involvement/experience look like? What were you
  passionate about?

In addition to the questions above, please *select one* of the questions below:

- What is something you have done that you are proud of?
- What's something you've always wanted to try but haven't had the chance to yet?
- What can always make you feel better after a bad day?
- What are three words would your friends use to describe you?

#### **BEFORE SUBMITTING:**

Make sure that your video submission link is accessible to all. We recommend that you upload and share a link from Youtube or a Google Drive account to maintain video quality.

#### TIPS:

- limit your background noise so that you can be clearly heard!
- many PNMs have chosen to wear a k-state gear for their video!
- it's okay to not get the perfect video on the first try!
- submit a video that you believe represents you, not what you think people want to see!

#### AWESOME OPPORTUNTIY:

Through this <u>link</u>, you can submit your first round video and a Recruitment Guide or member of our Panhellenic Executive Board will watch your video and provide feedback! If you think that this opportunity is something you would like to take advantage of, we recommend having your videos submitted through the link *no later than July 1*! If submitted after that date, there is no guarantee that we will be able to provide feedback in time! You can also find this link in your confirmation email, our instagram bio, our website, and the canvas page that you will be added to!

# A PANHELLENIC DICTIONARY

#### **RECRUITMENT**

The process of joining a sorority. The recruitment period is organized and implemented by the College
Panhellenic Council.

#### POTENTIAL NEW MEMBER (PNM)

Any woman interested in becoming a sorority member who is matriculated and eligible according to Panhellenic requirements.

#### **NEW MEMBER**

A woman who has accepted a bid but is not yet an initiated member.

#### BID

An invitation to join a sorority.

#### **CHAPTER**

A membership unit of a national/international sorority.

#### NATIONAL PANHELLENIC CONFERENCE (NPC)

A governing body composed of delegates from 26 women's national sororities, each autonomous as a social, Panhellenic letter society of college women, undergraduates, and almunae.

#### PANHELLENIC COUNCIL (PHC)

The collegiate governing body of the National Panhellenic Conference women's fraternities or sororities led by student members.

#### **LEGACY**

A relationship through a family member (mother, sister, or grandmother).

#### **INTERFRATERNITY COUNCIL (IFC)**

The collegiate governing body of the fraternities led by student members.

#### **FRATERNITY**

A values-based, social organization with a formed brotherhood and common principles.

#### **ALUMNA/ALUMNAE**

A women's fraternity or sorority member/s who is/are no longer a member of a collegiate chapter.

#### TOTAL

The allowable chapter size as determined by Panhellenic, and it includes both new members and initiated members.

#### HOUSE DIRECTOR/HOUSEMOTHER

A woman who lives in the sorority house, who serves as a "parent away from home" and cares for all of the women living in the sorority house. The house director may manage the house, supervise the kitchen responsibilities, and/or serve as the official hostess for chapter events.

#### MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT ACCEPTANCE BINDING AGREEMENT (MRABA)

A one-year binding agreement that a Potential New Member makes with the College Panhellenic Association on Preference Night during Formal Recruitment

# PNMBill of Rights

- 1. The right to be treated as an individual.
- 2. The right to be fully informed about the recruitment process.
- 3. The right to ask questions and receive true and objective answers from Recruitment Guides.
- 4. The right to be treated with respect.
- 5. The right to be treated as a capable and mature person without being patronized.
- 6. The right to have and express opinions to Recruitment Guides.
- 7. The right to have inviolable confidentiality when sharing information with Recruitment Guides.
- 8. The right to make informed choices without undue pressure from others.
- 9. The right to be fully informed about the binding agreements implicit in the acceptance card signing.
- 10. The right to make one's own choice and decision and accept full responsibility for the results of that decision.
- 11. The right to have a positive, safe, and enriching recruitment and pledging experience.

As members of the Kansas State University Panhellenic Council, we agree that our vision is of a safe, positive, enriching recruitment experience to provide opportunities for women to obtain membership in a women's fraternity. To reach our common goal, we will strive to create an environment of trust, honesty, unity, and cooperation among all chapters. Therefore, we solemnly promise to:

- Respect ourselves, our sisters, and the Greek community as a whole. We will work with other sororities to improve the fraternity and sorority experience as a whole.
- Enable every Potential New Member an equal opportunity and expectation to act accordingly with true Panhellenic spirit as well as our own chapter values and moral judgements.
- Promote the safety and protection of current and prospective members.
- Confront the concerns about alcohol and other illegal substances and promote the safety and protection of current and prospective members.
- Treat Potential New Members with the same respect before, during, and after Recruitment.
- Abide by all official Panhellenic codes, including, but not limited to, The National Panhellenic Creed, Potential New Member Bill of Rights, the Kansas State Panhellenic Council Recruitment Rules, the Kansas State Panhellenic Constitution, and the National Panhellenic Conference Unanimous Agreements.
- Leave the Potential New Member with a positive idea of what sisterhood could be.
- Encourage the Potential New Member to explore the freedom of thought in her decisions.
- Inform the Potential New Member about the recruitment process, membership, requirements, and external and internal responsibilities.
- Enable every Potential New Member an equal opportunity to a level playing field
- Strive to maintain a campus scholastic average that is above the allwomen's average.

#### MEMBERSHIP RECRUITMENT ACCEPTANCE

Binding Agreement

Part 1: Withdrawing or continuing in Recruitment, Initial one of the following options:

I am continuing in Recruitment. (Next Step: Continue to Part 2).
Part 2: Show that you understand the ranking process. Initial each statement. By signing the MRABA, I understand and agree that each of these statements is true:
I am willing to accept an invitation to membership ("bid") from any sorority I list in Part 4.
I will rank each sorority in the order of my preference for receiving a bid.
If I attend a sorority's Preference event, and I would not accept a bid from that sorority, I do not have to rank that sorority.
I understand that if I choose to rank fewer sororities, I might not receive a bid through Primary Recruitment.
Part 3: Show that you understand the effect of submitting the MRABA. Initial each statement below. By signing the MRABA, I understand and agree that each of these statements is true:
After I submit this form, I cannot change my rankings. I cannot add or delete any sororities through my rankings.
If I do not receive a bid from any sorority I ranked, I understand I am eligible to join any sorority later, through the COB process. I understand that not all sororities will recruit through COB.
If I do receive a bid from a sorority I ranked, but I choose not to accept a bid, I understand that I am not eligible to join any other sorority on this campus until the start of the next Primary Recruitment.

I have never been initiated into an NPC sorority. I understand that if I join an NPC sorority and choose to become an initiated member of that sorority, I cannot join another NPC member organization regardless of any circumstances.

#### What Does This Mean?

#### **ABOUT THE MRABA:**

The document on the opposite page is the Membership Recruitment Acceptance Binding Agreement (MRABA), formerly known as the "Preference Card". The MRABA is a binding agreement that is effective for one calendar year, **By signing this document, you as a Potential New Member agree that you are willing to accept a bid for membership from any sorority that you rank on the MRABA.** 

Please note that if you receive an invitation to membership (a bid) from any sorority that you ranked on your MRABA, then you are bound to that group for one calendar year (August 2025- August 2026). If you receive a bid from any sorority that you have listed on your MRABA, and you choose not to accept it or later withdraw from the new member process, you are not eligible to participate in Continuous Open Bidding (COB) in Fall 2025 **or** Spring 2026.

#### WHEN DO I SIGN THE MRABA?

If you receive an invitation to the Preference round, you will make your final selection at the conclusion of your last party. Here, you will rank the chapter(s) you visited on **August 20**, **2025** in preferential order. Once you complete your rankings, you will sign an electronic copy of the MRABA. Please note that once the MRABA has been completed and submitted, it cannot be altered or changed.

Before signing the MRABA, you have several options to consider. We suggest that you thoroughly reflect on these before signing your MRABA.

#### **MRABA OPTIONS:**


- 1. You may choose NOT to complete the MRABA, thereby withdrawing from recruitment. If you choose this option, you are eligible to accept a bid for membership from any sororities participating in Continuous Open Bidding. A small number of sororities may be able to recruit a limited number of women through the COB process after Primary Recruitment if their chapter is below the Campus Total; however, this is not guaranteed.
- 2. You may choose to list any sorority whose Preference Event you attended and from whom you are willing to accept an invitation of membership (a bid). Please note that you should NOT rank a sorority on your MRABA that you are absolutely not willing to accept a bid for membership. If you match with a sorority that you listed on your MRABA, it is important to note that you are bound to that sorority for one calendar year (August 2025 August 2026), regardless of whether you officially accept their invitation for membership or not.
- 3. You may choose to limit your choices to just one sorority whose Preference Event you attended and you are willing to accept an invitation to membership. You must understand that if you choose to single <u>Intentional Single Preference</u>, than you are not guaranteed to receive a bid for membership. Only Potential New Members who maximize their options and list ALL of the chapters that they attended during the Preference round are guaranteed to receive a bid for membership during Primary Recruitment.

If you do not receive an invitation to membership (a bid) from any of the sororities that you have listed, you are eligible for Continuous Open Bidding, The Vext Generation
OF SORORITY MEMBERS



Sorority recruitment can be an exciting yet overwhelming experience, especially for first-time participants. To help guide Potential New Members, we've compiled answers to some of the most frequently asked questions.

#### 1. What is Panhellenic Sorority Recruitment?

a. Panhellenic sorority recruitment is a structured process through which PNMs are introduced to sororities on a college campus. Typically, Recruitment takes place in the fall a week before classes officially begin. The purpose of this is for PNMs to learn about each sorority and meet the current members.

#### 2. How does the Recruitment process work?

- a. Here at Kansas State. Recruitment is divided into four different rounds. with Round 1 being virtual. Round 2 (Philanthropy Day) is when PNMs get the chance to learn more about the different philanthropies our chapters support. Round 3 (Sisterhood) is for chapters to showcase their sisterhoods and their facilities. 13 out of 14 chapters are housed on our campus. Alpha Omega Epsilon is not housed, nor do they participate in formal Recruitment. Click here for more information about their Recruitment process. Round 4 (Preference Day) is when PNMs build on their deep connection with up to two chapters and decide which one they can see themselves in. After Preference Day is over, each PNM will put those two chapters on a list and choose the one they would like to join. Bid Night follows a couple hours after the last round of Preference.
- 3. Can transfer students go through our Recruitment process?
  - a. Absolutely! As long as you have not signed a MRABA in the last calendar year or have been initiated into a chapter at your previous university, you are more than welcome to go through our Recruitment!
- 4. Is there a GPA requirement to join a sorority?
  - a. While the Panhellenic Council does not have a set GPA requirement for PNMs, we do strongly encourage a 3.0 out of a 4.0 scale in high school. Furthermore, most chapters have Active Member GPA requirements that is expected to be upheld should you join their chapter,




