The College of Earth, Ocean, and Atmospheric Sciences at Oregon State University invites applications for a part-time (.75 FTE), 12-month, fixed-term, Geospatial Science Instructor position. Reappointment is at the discretion of the Dean. The purpose of this position is to develop and deliver oncampus and Ecampus courses in geography and geospatial science for the College of Earth, Ocean, and Atmospheric Sciences (CEOAS).
