The Graduate School received the green light from the Provost to launch three search processes. We will be hiring two recruiters and a communication person. Information about

these searches will be provided in the coming weeks.

The recruiter positions are: Director of Recruitment and Graduate Recruiter. The role of the Graduate Recruitment unit will be:

- o to develop and implement a university level, coordinated, recruitment strategy for graduate students (Grad SEM)
- o to work collaboratively with all academic units, campus partners and KSU campuses in developing, implementing and continuously revising the graduate SEM
- o To identify individualized and targeted recruitment strategies and tactics for our different types of graduate student populations (i.e. master and doctoral, underserved minorities, geographical region, etc.)

The main role for the Communication and Marketing coordinator will be:

- o Develop and implement, with academic units, communication strategies and develop marketing materials that are aligned with the KSU Communications and Marketing Division's work and the university's brand.
- Serve as marketing coordinator for all digital, web-based and print materials for the K-State Graduate School by working with the Graduate School administrative team.

These actions support the mission of the Graduate School to provide strategic leadership and vision to advance graduate education in directions consistent with university goals and priorities, and to formulate and implement a comprehensive and visionary strategy that engages prospective and current graduate students from Kansas, across the country, and internationally.

Appendix A

Chapters 2B and 3B, respectively (Master's and Doctoral Supervisory Committees)

B. THE SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE

Upon admission to a master's degree program, the student confers with the head of the academic program and selects an advisor or major professor pro term from among the graduate faculty who are qualified to direct master's students and who are willing to assume the responsibility. Upon the recommendation of the head of the academic program, the Dean of the Graduate School then appoints a supervisory committee consisting of the major professor, who chairs the committee, and at least two other members of the graduate faculty**. The academic program recommends a supervisory committee for each student to the Graduate School. The supervisory committee shall consist of a major professor, who chairs the committee, and at least two other members of the graduate faculty**. After reviewing this recommendation, the Dean of the Graduate School approves the supervisory committee. In addition to the members recommended, the Dean of the Graduate School may appoint other members to the supervisory committee from the graduate faculty. All members of a student's supervisory committee participate as peers and have the responsibility for planning the program of study, advising the student, administering the final examination or evaluating the culminating experience, ensuring that University regulations and program requirements are met, and ensuring that the student's master's program is of high quality.

The supervisory committee also is responsible for ensuring that no conflicts of interest exist. Conflicts of interest to be avoided include those that may arise from personal or professional relationships between committee members, committee members and the student, with funding sources, and with any other stakeholders.

B. THE SUPERVISORY COMMITTEE

Upon admission to a doctoral program, the student confers with the head of the academic program and selects an advisor or major professor pro tem from among the graduate faculty who are certified to direct dissertations and who are willing to assume the responsibility. Upon the recommendation of the head of the academic program, the Dean of the Graduate School then appoints a supervisory committee consisting of the major professor, who chairs the committee, and at least three other members of the graduate faculty. The academic program recommends a supervisory committee for each student to the Graduate School. The supervisory committee shall consist of a major professor, who chairs the committee, and at least three other members of the graduate faculty**. After reviewing this recommendation, the Dean of the Graduate School approves the supervisory committee. On doctoral committees having co-major professors, at least one must be certified to direct dissertations. One member of the supervisory committee must be a graduate faculty member from outside the major professor's department. In addition to the members recommended, the Dean of the Graduate School may appoint other members to the supervisory committee from the graduate faculty. All members of a student's supervisory committee participate as peers and have the responsibility for planning the program of study, advising the student, administering the preliminary and final examinations, ensuring

that University regulations and program requirements are met, and ensuring that the student's doctoral program is of high quality.

The supervisory committee also is responsible for ensuring that no conflicts of interest exist. Conflicts of interest to be avoided include those that may arise from personal or professional relationships between committee members, committee members and the student, with funding sources, and with any other stakeholders.
