Deepthi Uppalapati – has been studying hard and made a few notable accomplishments: co-author of a recent peer reviewed publication and a review article just submitted for publication, received 3rd place for the best poster award in 2010 Phi Zeta Research Day activity at College of Veterinary Medicine (Dr. Masaaki Tamura)
