

About Kansas State University

Pounded in 1863 as the nation's first operational land-grant university, Kansas State University's mission is to foster excellent teaching, research and service that develop a highly skilled and educated citizenry necessary to advancing the well-being of Kansas, the nation and the international community. K-State embraces diversity and inclusion, encourages engagement and is committed to the discovery of knowledge, the education of undergraduate and graduate students, and improvement in the quality of life and standard of living of those we serve.

K-State has campuses in Manhattan, Olathe and Salina — home of the Aerospace and Technology Campus — as well as K-State Online, which serves distance education students around the world. When it comes to academics, K-State's majors and degree programs offer pathways to hundreds of career options that can be tailored to individual goals and dream careers. Interest areas offered through K-State's nine colleges and Graduate School include agriculture, food and natural resources; architecture, art and design; aviation; business; communications, media and marketing; computer science and information technology; education and leadership; engineering and construction; government, law and social sciences; health professions; hospitality and tourism; human and social services; humanities, culture and society; science and mathematics; veterinary medicine; and visual and performing arts.

Forbes magazine, U.S. News and World Report and The Princeton Review all recognize K-State as one of the best universities in the nation, which is backed by the strong support K-State receives from its alumni and friends. With more than 200,000

alumni, K-State's membership ranks Top 10 in the nation for the percentage of graduates who are members of the K-State Alumni Association. In 2020, the Kansas State University Foundation wrapped up the highly successful Innovation and Inspiration Campaign, raising \$1.6 billion for K-State.

Called the "Silicon Valley for biodefense" because of its leadership in food safety and security and agrodefense, K-State is home to several Feed the Future Innovation Labs, an initiative by the U.S. Agency for International Development to increase food production in nations with limited resources. The university also is home to the Biosecurity Research Institute, a biosafety level-3 facility devoted to comprehensive infectious disease research and training. Adjacent to the Manhattan campus, USDA's National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility, a world-class science facility for large animal agricultural research, training and diagnostics, completed construction in May 2022.

Total research efforts at Kansas State University have led to more than 350 patents to date. The university has more than 90 research centers, including the 8,600-acre Konza Prairie Biological Station and the Johnson Cancer Research Center. Our distinguished faculty members are tackling such issues as feeding a hungry world expected to reach 50 billion in population by 2050, climate change, cybersecurity, sustainable energy, urban revitalization and more — and they often involve undergraduate students in their work. K-State Research and Extension also serves the citizens of Kansas in a variety of ways, with personnel, offices, research centers, programs and more throughout the state.

About Our Ceremonies

University mace

The Kansas State University mace made its debut in September 2009 at the inauguration of Kirk H. Schulz as the university's 13th president. A mace is a decorative symbol of office and typically carried at the front of academic processions. Designed by Tom Boley, a 1970 K-State alumnus, the mace is made from a purple wood called purpleheart and a light-colored maple.

Academic dress

The history of academic dress dates to medieval European universities of the 12th century. Universities in the U.S. have standardized academic dress so its features are common and uniform throughout the country.

The gown — K-State undergraduate gowns are purple, and graduate gowns are black. Gowns are typically made of synthetic material or worsted wool. The pattern varies with the degree held: open sleeves for the bachelor's degree; long, closed sleeves with slits for the hands for the master's degree; and round, bell sleeves for the doctoral degree.

The hood — Students receiving graduate degrees wear hoods. The master's hood is shorter than the doctoral hood and lacks the panels of the doctoral hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the university; K-State's lining is purple with two inverted chevrons. The binding or edging of the hood is the color pertaining to the subject of the degree.

The caps — All bachelor's candidates wear a purple mortarboard, and master's degree candidates wear a black mortarboard. Doctoral students may wear a mortarboard or a soft velvet tam with either six or eight sides. The tams can be dark blue or black for Doctor of Philosophy candidates and light blue for Doctor of Education candidates. Doctor of Veterinary Medicine candidates wear a black mortarboard. Tassel color for all degree candidates depends on the degree and/or degree field.

Graduation honors

Bachelor's degree candidates who are earning graduation honors from Kansas State University wear a purple-and-white honor cord on the left shoulder of their commencement gowns. Honors are awarded based on their K-State grade point averages. Eligible students also must have completed a minimum of 60 undergraduate hours at K-State, with at least 42 undergraduate hours in graded courses at K-State.

K-State graduation honors:

Summa cum laude — For students with a 3.95 or

Magna cum laude — For students with a 3.85-3.949 GPA

Cum laude — For students with a 3.75-3.849 GPA.

Note: Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree candidates receive these honors based on courses completed in the professional program. For the purpose of the commencement ceremony, unofficial graduation honors are recognized for bachelor's degree candidates who possess the required K-State cumulative GPA prior to the start of the semester in which they plan to participate in the commencement ceremony, and who have completed or are currently enrolled in enough credit hours to satisfy the credit hour requirements.

Neelima Parasker was appointed to the Kansas Board of Regents by Governor Laura Kelly

harles Taber serves ✓ as the provost and executive vice president of Kansas State University, providing strategic leadership on all aspects of university governance and the academic enterprise. As the university's chief academic officer, Taber is responsible for all undergraduate and graduate

academic programs,

overseeing academic planning, resource allocation and innovation while ensuring excellence and

relevance in the design of the curriculum. Taber works closely with President Richard Linton and the K-State community to develop and advance the university's Next-Gen strategic plan. Taber came to K-State from the position of vice provost for graduate and professional education and dean of the graduate school at Stony Brook University, New

A leading scholar in the fields of political psychology and computational modeling, Taber has more than 50 scholarly publications with more than 13,000 citations. He has been the principal investigator of 14 projects sponsored by the

National Science Foundation. In 2000, he received the Paul Lazersfeld outstanding paper award from the American Political Science Association for a paper on the causes of bias in political reasoning, published in the American Journal of Political Science. His 2013 book "The Rationalizing Voter," coauthored with Milton Lodge, won three National Book of the Year Awards. Provost Taber's research and career have been the subject of numerous profiles in the scientific and popular press. He has directed 22 completed doctoral dissertations, more than 100 master's theses and more than 500 undergraduate honors theses.



Awards

Kansas State University has bestowed the title of university distinguished professor, a lifetime honor, upon five faculty members in 2023: Allen Featherstone, professor and department head of agricultural economics; Ari Jumpponen, professor of biology; Jun Li, professor of chemistry; Jesse Nippert, professor of biology; and Caterina Scoglio, professor of electrical and computer engineering.

University distinguished professors are appointed following a universitywide nomination and evaluation process conducted by the provost. The five faculty members receive a personalized plaque and medallion.



Allen Featherstone

Precognized as a leading expert in the field of agricultural finance and agriculture production economics. His research includes some of the most impactful areas in agricultural economics, including the influences of taxes on farmland, the probability of agricultural

eatherstone is globally

loan default and loan loss severity, groundwater allocation in irrigated crop production, management of corn yields and interactions of weather and soils.

Awarded more than \$7.1 million in research funding, Featherstone has published more than 150 peer-reviewed journal articles, and his work has been reported in leading national publications and outlets. An internationally recognized conference speaker and presenter, Featherstone has been honored by many professional organizations. In 2005, he received K-State's Commerce Bank Distinguished Graduate Faculty award. Featherstone was instrumental in the development of the university's innovative Master of Agribusiness program, and he has been the director of the program since its inception in 1997.



Ari Jumpponen

Sumpponen is a fungal ecology researcher whose current research focuses on the effects of fire on soil and soil-dwelling organisms, which is important to understand as wildfire risks increase. He has received \$4.6 million in total research funding and has been recognized as being among the top 2% of researchers

worldwide by Stanford University. The results of his work have been published in 140 peer-reviewed scientific articles and more than a dozen book chapters, and he has provided ad hoc manuscript reviews for more than 60 scientific journals.

Academically, Jumpponen has advised or co-advised 14 graduate students and nearly 50 undergraduates since he joined K-State in 2000. From 2011-2016, he served as principal investigator of a National Science Foundation-funded grant for an undergraduate training program, URM: Undergraduate Research and Mentoring in Ecological Genomics. He received the 2022 Division of Biology Outstanding Graduate Faculty Award.




Jun Li

T i is a highly accomplished nanomaterials and nanotechnology expert whose current research focuses on energy conversion and storage, biosensor development, and nanomaterial growth and composite materials synthesis He has been awarded \$8.35 million in research funding and has produced 148 peer-

reviewed journal articles, 25 conference papers, 23 book chapters and one co-edited book. Li holds 13 U.S. patents, one Japanese patent, two international Protected Cooperation Treaty applications and one protected international World Intellectual Property Organization patent.

Li teaches undergraduate chemistry courses and two interdisciplinary graduate nanotechnology classes that he developed. He has served as an advisor for 19 graduate students, five postdoctoral fellows and eight visiting scholars. In 2018, Li was recognized with the Professorial Performance Award and the Segebrecht Award. He has been named a fellow of the 2022 International Association of Advanced Materials, the 2021 Royal Society of Chemistry and the 2019 National Academy of Inventors.



\$23 million in research funding, Nippert's research

has resulted in 110 publications in peer-reviewed journals. He is the principal investigator for the National Science Foundation-funded Long-Term Ecological Research program at the Konza Prairie Biological Station.

Nippert secured funding from the National Science Foundation in 2016 to develop a national training program to provide immersive workshops for plant ecology graduate and postdoctoral researchers. He was also instrumental in developing an interdisciplinary environmental sciences degree program that launched in fall 2021. He has served as a major advisor for one postdoctoral scholar, 15 graduate students and 16 undergraduate researchers. Nippert has been recognized with the H. Henley Haymaker Teaching Excellence Award, the William L Stamey Teaching Award, the Karen Ann Griffith Research Award, a Big 12 Faculty Fellowship and other accolades.



Caterina Scoglio

 $S_{\text{expert in the field}}^{\text{coglio is a high-impact}}$ of network science and contact-network models for epidemic spreading. Her research team developed a generalized epidemic modeling software tool, which has been widely adopted by other researchers and applied to simulating the spread of many

infectious diseases. Scoglio and her research group produced accurate predictions of the spread of COVID-19 in Wuhan City, China, and the 2019 Ebola cases in Uganda.

Scoglio has been awarded more than \$15.5 million in research funding, and her research has led to 114 journal publications, 74 conference publications, six book chapters and 49 invited talks. She has been an advisor to 42 graduate students. K-State has recognized Scoglio's work with several honors, including the Commerce Bank and W.T. Kemper Foundation Distinguished Graduate Faculty Award, the Engineering Distinguished Researcher Award, the Frankenhoff Outstanding Research Award, and the role of Steve Hsu Keystone research faculty scholar.

Aleksan Shanoyan

Aleksan Shanoyan is an associate professor of agricultural economics at K-State. He earned a bachelor's degree in 2003 from the Armenian Agricultural Academy, a master's degree from the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign in 2007, and a doctorate from Michigan State University

in 2011. His research is in the area of agribusiness economics and management with a focus on supply chain coordination, strategic management and business development.

Shanoyan's research projects have addressed issues across several industries, ranging from dairy, meat and vegetables to grain and biofuel in local, regional and international contexts. His most

recent research projects examine contracting and vertical coordination strategies in beef and biofuel supply chains, the resilience of agri-food systems, the economics of pet food, big data applications in agriculture and the facilitation of agri-food supply chains in developing economies.
