

About Kansas State University

Pounded in 1863 as the nation's first operational land-grant university, Kansas State University's mission is to foster excellent teaching, research and service that develop a highly skilled and educated citizenry necessary to advancing the well-being of Kansas, the nation and the international community. K-State embraces diversity and inclusion, encourages engagement and is committed to the discovery of knowledge, the education of undergraduate and graduate students, and improvement in the quality of life and standard of living of those we serve.

K-State has campuses in Manhattan, Olathe and Salina — home of the Aerospace and Technology Campus — as well as K-State Online, which serves distance education students around the world. Rated an R-1 — the highest level — research university, K-State research has led to more than 350 patents to date. The university has more than 90 research centers, including the 8,600-acre Konza Prairie Biological Station and the Johnson Cancer Research Center. K-State Research and Extension serves the citizens of Kansas with personnel, offices, research centers, programs and more throughout the state.

Major research areas at K-State include biosecurity and biodefense; biologics development; agricultural systems innovations; digital agriculture and advanced analytics; pet nutrition and animal health; atomic, molecular and optical physics; high energy physics; and grassland ecology. Called the "Silicon Valley for biodefense" because of its leadership in food safety and security and agrodefense, the Manhattan campus is home the Biosecurity Research Institute, a biosafety level-3 facility devoted to comprehensive infectious disease research and training. Adjacent to the campus is the National Bio and Agro-Defense Facility, the federal government's premier animal disease research

About Our Ceremonies

University mace

The Kansas State University mace made its debut in September 2009 at the inauguration of Kirk H. Schulz as the university's 13th president. A mace is a decorative symbol of office and typically carried at the front of academic processions. Designed by Tom Boley, a 1970 K-State alumnus, the mace is made from a purple wood called purpleheart and a light-colored maple.

Academic dress

The history of academic dress dates to medieval European universities of the 12th century. Universities in the U.S. have standardized academic dress so its features are common and uniform throughout the country.

The gown — At K-State, gowns are black and typically made of synthetic material or worsted wool. The pattern varies with the degree held: open sleeves for the bachelor's degree; long, closed sleeves with slits for the hands for the master's degree; and round, bell sleeves for the doctoral degree.

The hood — Students receiving graduate degrees wear hoods. The master's hood is shorter than the doctoral hood and lacks the panels of the doctoral hood. Hoods are lined with the colors of the university; K-State's lining is purple with two inverted chevrons. The binding or edging of the hood is the color pertaining to the subject of the degree.

The caps — All bachelor's and master's degree candidates wear a black mortarboard. Doctoral students may wear a mortarboard or a soft velvet tam with either six or eight sides. The tams can be dark blue or black for Doctor of Philosophy candidates, and light blue for Doctor of Education candidates. Doctor of Veterinary Medicine candidates wear a black mortarboard. Tassel color for all degree candidates depends on the degree and/or degree field.

Bachelor's degree candidates who are earning graduation honors from Kansas State University wear a purple-and-white honor cord on the left shoulder of their commencement gowns. Honors are awarded based on their K-State grade point averages. Eligible students also must have completed a minimum of 60 undergraduate hours at K-State, with at least 42 undergraduate hours in graded courses at K-State.

K-State graduation honors:

Summa cum laude — For students with a 3.95 or above GPA.

Magna cum laude — For students with a 3.85-3.949 GPA.

Cum laude — For students with a 3.75-3.849 GPA. Note: Doctor of Veterinary Medicine degree candidates receive these honors based on courses completed in the professional program. For the purpose of the commencement ceremony, unofficial graduation honors are recognized for bachelor's degree candidates who possess the required K-State cumulative GPA prior to the start of the semester in which they plan to participate in the commencement ceremony, and who have completed or are currently enrolled in enough credit hours to satisfy the credit hour requirements.

Kansas Board of Regents



Jon Rolph

Jon Rolph was appointed to the Kansas Board of Regents in 2019 by Gov. Laura Kelly and currently serves as board chairman. A Wichitabased businessman, Rolph is president and CEO of Thrive Restaurant Group, which owns and operates over 100 restaurants, including Applebee's, Carlos

O'Kelly's, HomeGrown and Bake Sale Treat Parlor. The restaurants are in 12 states across the Midwest and Appalachia.

Rolph is a 2001 magna cum laude graduate of Baylor University where he was a two-time student body president. After graduating, he worked with college student leaders as an intern for the National Student Leadership Forum in Washington, D.C. Rolph returned to Kansas in 2002 to work in the family-owned businesses started by his father, David Rolph, and his uncle, Darrel Rolph.

At the restaurant group, Rolph has served in several key positions, including restaurant-level operations, vice president of administration and marketing, and chief operating officer of Carlos O'Kelly's, eventually succeeding his father as president of Sasnak Management, which was rebranded in early 2019 to Thrive Restaurant Group.

Along with his service on the Kansas Board of Regents, Rolph has served on the boards of several local and national organizations, including the Wichita Children's Home, United Way of the Plains, the Wichita Metro Chamber of Commerce, chairman of Visioneering Wichita, the Center for Combating Human Trafficking and the Wichita Metro YMCA. His current board memberships and affiliations include vice chairman of the

Greater Wichita Partnership, board of directors of INTRUST Bank, chairman of Centralized Supply Chain Services and the Applebee's Franchise Business Council, and a board advocate for the Baylor Collaborative on Hunger and Poverty. He also was appointed by Gov. Kelley to the executive committee of Strengthening People and Revitalizing Kansas, or SPARK.

Rolph and his wife, Lauren, are both fifthgeneration Kansans. They have been married for more than 16 years and have six children.

Speaker



Richard H. Linton

Richard H. Linton serves as the 15th president of Kansas State University. He holds a bachelor's degree in biology, a master's degree in food science and a doctorate in food science, all from Virginia Tech University. He participated in the Food Systems Leadership Institute from 2009-2011 and completed

the Harvard Graduate School's Institutional Educational Management Program in 2018.

Before coming to K-State in February 2022, Linton served as dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences at North Carolina State University from 2012-2022, as department chair of food science and technology at The Ohio State University from 2011-2012, and as a faculty member of the

department of food science at Purdue University from 1994-2011. While at Purdue, Linton also served as the founder and director of the Center for Food Safety Engineering and as the associate director of agricultural research programs.

As dean of the College of Agriculture and Life Sciences, or CALS, at NC State, Linton led a college of over 300 faculty, with more than 3,000 undergraduate students and 1,000 graduate students. Under his direction, the college developed a new strategic plan focused on building people, programs and partnerships. Collaboration with industry and government were critical to the mission of the college, and Linton's dedication was demonstrated through the NC Plant Sciences Initiative and the NC Food Processing and Manufacturing Initiative, two endeavors that have the potential to create jobs, find solutions to global challenges in agriculture and foster support for local growers. During his tenure at NC State, competitive

research for CALS reached \$100 million a year and his college raised \$482 million for the NC State Capital Campaign.

Linton held many important leadership roles in addition to serving as dean. He continues to serve as a member of the Food and Drug Administration's Science Advisory Board, as well as the chair for the Binational — Israel/U.S. — Ag Research and Development Fund, a role to which he was appointed in 2018 by the U.S. secretary of agriculture. He also previously chaired the North Carolina Governor's Task Force on Food Manufacturing and the APLU-Healthy Food Systems, Healthy People Steering Committee.

Linton and his wife, Sally, an ADHD/executive function life coach, have two children: a daughter, Lily, and a son, Chris.

Awards

Kansas State University has bestowed the title of university distinguished professor, a lifetime honor, on four faculty members in 2022: Hans Coetzee, professor and head of anatomy and physiology; Roman Ganta, professor of diagnostic medicine and pathobiology and director of the Center of Excellence for Vector-Borne Diseases; Brian Geisbrecht, professor of biochemistry and molecular biophysics; and Robert Goodband, professor of animal sciences and industry and extension swine specialist.

University distinguished professors are appointed following a universitywide nomination and evaluation process conducted by the provost. The four faculty members receive a personalized plaque and medallion.



Hans Coetzee

Coetzee is
internationally
recognized for developing
objective measures of
pain during routine
husbandry procedures in
food-producing animals,
including beef and dairy
cattle, sheep and swine.
Coetzee also researches
bovine anaplasmosis and
developed a single-dose

implant vaccine that provides long-term immunity against anaplasmosis infections.

Awarded more than \$21.2 million in research funding in the last 16 years, with over \$18 million from highly competitive federal sources such as the U.S. Department of Agriculture, Coetzee has authored or co-authored over 200 peer-reviewed manuscripts in the same period. He also is highly in demand for consultation by livestock producers, practitioners, academic researchers and pharmaceutical companies on livestock pain assessment. He has presented his work at continuing education sessions and conferences around the world.



Roman Ganta

anta is an international authority on tick-borne rickettsial diseases, contributing significantly to the knowledge of the biology, pathogenesis, immunology, diagnostics and vaccine studies of rickettsial pathogens from the Ehrlichia species, Anaplasma species and Rickettsia species,

particularly E. chaffeensis, E. canis, E. ruminantium, A. marginale, A. phagocytophilum and R. rickettsia, which are spread by the bite of infected ticks.

As a principal investigator, Ganta has received approximately \$19.65 million in extramural research funding since joining K-State in 1998. His work has led to seven patents as inventor or co-inventor and he has eight more patent applications under review. Ganta established the Center of Excellence for Vector-Borne Disease in 2015 at the College of Veterinary Medicine to highlight and expand vector-borne disease research program at K-State.



Brian Geisbrecht

G eisbrecht is one of the world's experts on the structure and biochemistry of proteins that function in the innate immune system. In particular, his lab studies molecules produced by pathogenic bacteria that block activity of these innate immune components. Geisbrecht's work to date has determined and

published the molecular structures of more than 30 proteins of the innate immune system or their bacterially-derived inhibitors. His laboratory's objective is to understand these interactions at the molecular level and to use that information as a basis for therapeutic discovery and development.

Since joining the K-State biochemistry and molecular biophysics department in 2013, Geisbrecht has received National Institutes of Health support of \$5.8 million. Geisbrecht has served on national and international grant review panels and on the editorial board of several respected scientific journals, including the Journal of Immunology. He has been an invited speaker and presenter at conferences and meetings across the U.S. and world.



Robert Goodband

Goodband is part
of a national and
internationally known
swine nutrition team
with programs focused on
developing, evaluating and
disseminating the latest
information to increase
the profitability of pork
producers while maintaining
the highest level of animal
health and welfare.

He also is internationally known for his research on feed processing, feed management and swine nutrient requirements. His research found that reducing the grain particle size in swine feed from 900 microns to the currently recommended 300 to 500 microns results in a 5% reduction in feed usage industrywide and improves the profitability and sustainability of swine producers. It also has reduced the environmental impact of the industry by reducing swine waste by more than 20%. Awarded research grants totaling \$13.8 million, Goodband's work has produced eight patents, more than 400 refereed journal papers, nine book chapters, 900 research reports and 170 extension publications.

Thomas Lane

Bringing more than 25 years of student life administration experience, Thomas Lane became vice president for student life and dean of students at Kansas State University in July 2019.

Lane provides executivelevel leadership, strategic planning, oversight

and coordination of all units in the Division of Student Life. He also guides development and implementation of high-quality and student-centered approaches to support student success in nonacademic dimensions of student university experiences, and he responds to student crises and issues and concerns, among many other duties.

Before joining K-State, Lane served as associate vice president for student affairs and dean of students at Missouri State University since 2015. Lane joined Missouri State in 2005 as assistant

He was promoted to assistant to the vice president for student affairs in 2008, retaining directorship of the union and overseeing a major renovation to the facility. Philip Nel

Philip Nel is a university distinguished professor of English at Kansas State University. Nel co-founded and directs the graduate program in children's literature. An occasional guest on media programs and popular invited speaker, he has given lectures in the U.S. and around the world.

Nel is the author or coeditor of 13 books and over 50 articles. His "Was the Cat in the Hat Black?: The Hidden Racism of Children's Literature and the Need for Diverse Books," published by Oxford University Press in 2017, was featured in Time magazine, The Atlantic, the Washington Post and the Chicago Tribune. His "Talk at Google" version of the book has been viewed over 12,000 times. That work and the work of Katie Ishizuka and Ramón Stephens led to Dr. Seuss Enterprises' March 2021 decision to cease publication of six Seuss books with racist imagery.

Nel's "Tales for Little Rebels," co-edited with Julia Mickenberg and published in 2008, won favorable reviews from the New York Times Book Review and the Washington Post. His double biography, "Crockett Johnson and Ruth Krauss: How an Unlikely Couple Found Love, Dodged the FBI, and Transformed Children's Literature," published in 2012, received praise from the Wall Street Journal and Kirkus. Of his "The Annotated Cat: Under the Hats of Seuss and His Cats," published in 2007, Newsweek wrote, "Philip Nel gives us a better grip on just why Dr. Seuss has so thoroughly captured the imaginations of several generations of readers — and the imaginations of their parents."

A K-State faculty member since 2000, Nel earned bachelor's degrees in English and psychology from the University of Rochester and a master's degree and doctorate in English from Vanderbilt University.

A first-generation college student from South Dakota, Don Munce began his career in college admissions during his freshman year, serving as a college ambassador for Augustana University. His work in college admissions continued uninterrupted for another 47 years, progressing to different

titles such as admissions counselor, director of admissions and financial aid, director of student affairs, executive director of students affairs and finally ending with the title chief executive officer and owner of the National Research Center for College and University Admissions.

Munce is recognized as an innovative, entrepreneurial leader in marketing and enrollment planning services in higher education. The college planning program he developed was credited as "having resulted in the nationwide enrollment of more underrepresented student populations than any other single influence." His innovative Encoura data platform, an enrollment management technology platform that combines student intelligence data,

advanced analytics and education-specific research, was the first major use of artificial intelligence to predict the most likely college enrollment choices by students at institutions across America.

Munce is active as a board member and volunteers for many institutions and nonprofit organizations, currently serving as the chairman of the board at the Nonprofit Leadership Alliance in Kansas City. His family foundation has been actively supporting programs at Kansas State University, Augustana University, Central Christian College, the American Legion and the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children, along with other educational and youth-serving organizations.

He earned his bachelor's degree at Augustana University in Sioux Falls, South Dakota, and received his master's degree in adolescent development from Kansas State University.

Munce and his wife, Robyn, have five children and two stepchildren, along with six grandchildren. Outside of work, he can be found at Kansas City Chiefs games, as he has been a season ticket holder for 30 years and is considered one of the elite tailgate hosts at Arrowhead Stadium.


