Queer Studies Course Descriptions Summer 2018

GWSS 500 Top/Black Sexualities

Section: ZA: Distance --Tushabe

This course benefits students who wish to explore diverse sexual identities, desires, and behaviors existing in the public. Professionals working in the community can unwittingly assume a sexuality and in those they serve. Lack of exposure to various sexual behaviors leads to assumptions based on either mainstream heteronormative ideals or the personnel experiences of the professional. This course offers an expanded look at both common and uncommon sexual behaviors, desires, and identities in the population as well as risk factor considerations. Students will analyze current understandings of sexualities through a feminist examination of power and normative constructs. This increased expertise allows professionals to address sexuality more skillfully, create more effective interventions when needed, and provide better service.
