As a K-State retiree, you can keep (and gain) many valuable perks.

Access these benefits after your official retirement date—they never expire.

How do I access the retiree perks?

Retiree Wildcat OneCard: Visit the K-State ID Center and bring an approved PER-39 Change or Separation Form. Your retiree Wildcat OneCard enables access to services requiring an ID and will assist you in obtaining other retiree perks.

Library Access: Retirees can sign up for community patron access by contacting the K-State Library.

Parking Permit: Bring your Wildcat OneCard and PER-39 form to Parking Services. *The retiree permit does not include garage access; an additional permit/cost may apply.*

Rec Complex Membership: Please note that you must be a retiree with at least 5 years of service to qualify for this perk. Bring your Wildcat OneCard to Rec Services to obtain a free membership for you and your spouse.

Athletics Tickets (faculty/staff rate): Purchase discounted tickets through the athletics ticket office. Valid K-State IDs are required.

- Free membership to the Peters Recreation Complex
- Discounted athletics tickets
