WHAT ARE THE PERKS FOR K-STATE RETIREES?

- Retiree K-State ID card
- Continued access to the library
- Retiree parking permit
- Membership to the Peters Recreation Complex
- K-State Athletics tickets

WHEN CAN I OBTAIN THESE PERKS?

- You must wait until you are officially retired in K-State's Human Resource Information System (HRIS).
- You may obtain these perks at your convenience as they do not expire.

HOW DO I OBTAIN THESE PERKS?

- Retirees may obtain a retiree K-State ID card from the K-State ID Center by bringing an approved PER-39, Change or Separation Form to the center. This ID enables retirees access to all services that require an ID card, such as those offered by the K-State Libraries.
- Parking permits are available at no charge and may be obtained by bringing a retiree K-State ID card or an approved PER-39, Change or Separation Form to the parking garage. Please note, the retiree parking permit does not give automatic access to the parking garage and there may be an additional cost for that permit.
- Membership to the Peters Recreation Complex is available at no charge. Bring your retiree K-State ID card to the Recreation Services office to obtain membership.
- Retirees qualify for the faculty/staff ticketing rate for K-State Athletics events. Valid IDs are required.
