## **Scholar Responsibilities**

1. You must have health insurance that meets the minimum requirements of the U.S. Department of State for the entire period listed on your DS-2019.

Medical benefits- per accident or illness\$100,000Repatriation of remains\$25,000Medical evacuation\$50,000Deductible per accident or illness\$500

- 2. Report any change in email address; mailing address; or phone number to Maria Beebe at <a href="mailto:pappy@ksu.edu">pappy@ksu.edu</a> within 10 days of the change.
- 3. Report the departure of you or any dependents if it is prior to the end date on the DS-2019 to <a href="mailto:pappy@ksu.edu">pappy@ksu.edu</a>.
- 4. File annual income tax. If you are not receiving money from K-State, you must still file the Form 8843 with the Internal Revenue Service. See:

- 5. Have your DS-2019 signed when traveling outside the U.S.
- 6. Keep a valid passport. Your passport should be valid for 6 months into the future.
- 7. Keep your DS-2019 current. If you plan to stay beyond the end date or grace period of the DS-2019, request an extension in a timely manner.
