

## **GROW Saturday Workshop Mentor Position Description**

Mentors are paid staff members of KAWSE (K-State Office for the Advancement of Women in Science and Engineering) who serve as group leaders at our GROW Saturday workshops. Mentors are responsible for chaperoning a group of students, usually 8-12 at a time, to a schedule of activities set out for them when they sign up for one of our workshops. Mentors are paid hourly and receive a free lunch at events. This position is intended for undergraduate students.

## GROW Saturday Workshop: STEM Superheroes – March 2, 2024

The KAWSE office is looking to hire undergraduate student mentors to help with our Girls Researching Our World (GROW) workshop on Saturday, March 2, 2024. As a mentor, you would be responsible for chaperoning a group of 8-12 middle school students (the majority of whom are girls) to a set schedule of activities throughout the day. Hours of employment are 8am-4pm. Pay is \$9/hour. Applications are accepted on a rolling basis until all positions are filled. The event schedule is as follows:

The activity sessions are led by volunteer faculty and student groups. Mentors are there to help the facilitator as needed (passing out supplies, making sure students are engaged and paying attention to the instructor). You would also be responsible for facilitating some team-building/ ice breaker activities during down time with your group.
