Mentions: \$500 each.

Duration Depends on how quickly you spend it.

Eligibility

Who Any full-time student enrolled at K-State with more than 60 hours completed.

When Junior or senior status. December graduates may compete in their final semester.

Students on study abroad are eligible to submit.

Selection Criteria Essay must grapple with an ethical/moral matter of contemporary interest. Winning

essays will prompt meaningful reflection, have thematic unity and grasp the complexity of the issue. Strong writing skills and a personal voice are key.

Campus Deadline No internal deadline. However, you must have a faculty sponsor. That person

reads your essay and formally endorses its high quality.

Deadline December in recent years.

Application Materials submitted electronically. 3,000 to 4,000 words with some format guide-

lines. Entry form signed by you and a faculty sponsor. Verification of student

status.
