K-State Course or Student Organization Activity Pilot Grant Application Spring 2025

As part of Next-Gen K-State efforts, incentive grants are available as seed funds for faculty teaching courses or advisors to student organizations to deepen, scale-up, and expand existing applied learning experiences.

The experience must meet the ALE Framework requirements. [To view the Framework](#), or to get in touch with a member of our team, please visit the KSU Applied Learning Experiences webpage.

Funding range: \$500–\$5,000 total, to be utilized over 1 year, by conclusion of FY 2026.

Eligible to apply: K-State faculty and faculty advisors to student organizations, with at least one year of service to the university.

Support: Letter of support from Department Head or from Dean of College (if a college-wide organization) is required.

Match: None required.

This application will ask basic logistical questions, then will break questions into 5 sections that specifically address the ALE Framework. Finally, a few other general questions will be asked. If you will not be completing this application in one sitting, we recommend keeping answers in a word processing document to avoid losing work.
