Biography	 The K-State LGBT Resource Center in Diversity and Multicultural Student Affairs, in partnership with alumni and donors, have created funds to recognize the contributions of an LGBTQ+ or allied student, faculty or staff member. These funds can assist in covering expenses related to traveling to or attending educational or professional conferences/meetings/etc. Current Kansas State University students must have a cumulative GPA of 2.5 or higher to be considered for funding. Students may appeal this requirement, if not met, by addressing the circumstances for the current cumulative GPA and the student's measures to address the circumstances in the future. This appeal should be attached with the cover letter and request form at time of submittal. Documentation of circumstances can be attained by speaking with the Office of Student Life, Diversity and Multicultural Student Affairs, or departmental advisor. A representative of the Student Life division or advisor will need to confirm the written appeal. 		
	Faculty and Staff must provide information on how their attendance to a particular event/conference can improve their mentorship to the LGBTQ student community or enhance their academic/professional endeavors.		
	Requests are only considered to attend functions that are specifically inclusive of LGBT activities, research, or leadership. Funding will be determined by members of the LGBT Resource Center Advisory Board and based upon the number of requests for funding, extent of the individual's involvement with the conference/meeting (i.e. presenting vs. attending), and location of said conference/meeting		
Eligibility	The applicant of the scholarship must meet the following criteria to receive the scholarship. If applicant does not meet all the criteria, they may address and appeal in their essay to be submitted.		
	 The recipient(s) of this scholarship will be a student properly enrolled in any curriculum at Kansas State University. The recipient(s) must have a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5, based on a 4.0 scale. The recipient(s) must be a permanent resident of the United States. 		
Other Criteria	 The applicant must submit all of the following materials to be considered for the scholarship. 1. Applicants Information Page 2. Essay Submission 3. Signed Release of Information Form 		
Selection Timeline	A funding committee comprised of university faculty and staff will evaluate applications. Incomplete applications will not be accepted. The application must be submitted 21 days in advance of the event.
