

Infectious Diseases and Zoonoses MPH Emphasis

This public health emphasis prepares professionals to strengthen zoonoses prevention and control programs, investigate emerging infectious diseases, enhance the public's ability to respond to bioterrorism and biosecurity emergencies, and coordinate rapid response activities among government, agriculture industries, nonprofit organizations, and academia. The MPH program at K-State is accredited through the Council on Education for Public Health (CEPH).

Job titles of MPH/DVM students with this emphasis include: Practicing Veterinarians; U.S. Army Veterinary Corp Officer; USDA APHIS Epidemiology team leader; International work with NGOs; State Veterinarians; Senior Consultant with Booz Allen Hamilton; Clinical Research Coordinator; Animal Health Coordinator Kansas Department of Agriculture.

Job titles of regular MPH students with this emphasis include: Disease Investigators with state and county health departments; Peace Corp; PhD student; Nursing student; Research Assistant/Technician in diagnostic labs; Select Agent Specialist with NBAF; Environmental Health Specialist with a county health department; International work with NGOs; Epidemiologists for state and county health departments; Civilian working for U.S. Army Public Health Command office.

Eligible applicants must hold a bachelor degree (BS or BA) with a preferred GPA of 3.0/4.0 in the last 60 hours of coursework.
