K-State Theatre Directing Mentorship Program

Are you ready to take creative ownership, lead a team of artists, and bring a powerful story to life?

The **Directing Mentorship Program** at K-State Theatre gives senior theatre majors the opportunity to direct a fully produced show as part of the official season. With faculty mentorship at every stage, this program invites bold artistic vision, thoughtful risk-taking, and creative exploration within a safe and collaborative environment.

Directing is never a solo act—it's a dynamic, team-driven process. This program encourages student directors to think holistically:

- How will your vision align with student or faculty designers?
- How will casting—particularly with respect to inclusion, ensemble storytelling, and the available acting pool—shape your approach?

This is your opportunity to lead with intention, center community, and bring to life a production that reflects your voice and values.

Overview & Eligibility

This program is open to **senior K-State Theatre majors** who are passionate about directing and committed to collaboration and artistic leadership.

Applicants must:

- Be in good academic standing
- Have completed (or be currently enrolled in) foundational theatre coursework
- Demonstrate strong communication, time management, and collaboration skills

Student Expectations & Requirements

To be considered for the program, applicants must:

- Maintain a minimum GPA of 3.0
- Actively participate in K-State Theatre service activities (e.g., KSTO, Ebony Theatre, KSTO Day, Theatre Student for a Day)
- Show reliability, initiative, and a collaborative spirit across all aspects of the process

Purpose & Context

The Directing Mentorship Program serves as a **launchpad for emerging directors**, offering a bridge between classroom learning and fully realized production.

Student directors will:

- Participate in all phases of production—from script analysis to final performance
- Lead a rehearsal space grounded in inclusion, consent, empathy, and self-care
- Balance artistic leadership with collaborative engagement

Note: Not all proposals will be selected for a Chapman Season slot.

Faculty will assess each proposal based on:

- Design and collaboration opportunities
- Production feasibility
- Alignment with the season's goals
- Potential student learning outcomes

All applicants follow the same submission process, regardless of whether the project is ultimately selected for a mainstage or studio production.

Directing with a Spirit of Collaboration

At K-State Theatre, directing means leading with **care**, **creativity**, **and clarity**. Directors are expected to:

- Foster a positive, inclusive, and safe rehearsal environment
- Collaborate respectfully with actors, mentors, and design/tech teams
- Align their work with K-State Theatre's educational values

Design Staffing:

Each director will be assigned a **faculty designer**, a **mentored student designer**, or both—determined by the Design/Tech faculty.

Directors may not independently recruit their design team. If staffing is limited, faculty will determine appropriate adjustments to ensure project support.

Application Process

Step 1: Faculty Meeting

Before submitting your application, meet with a theatre faculty member to:

- Express your interest in directing
- Discuss possible play selections
- Explore how your project fits within the program's resources and casting pool

Step 3: Proposal Presentation

Present a **visual proposal** (e.g., PowerPoint, Prezi, Canva) to the Acting/Directing Faculty. Your presentation should demonstrate:

- Artistic clarity and originality
- Practical, well-thought-out planning
- Readiness to lead a collaborative creative process

Production Parameters

Your proposed play must meet the following criteria:

- Contemporary play (written within the last 50 years)
- Cast size no larger than 6 actors
- Realistic budget and resource requirements
- No musicals or works requiring elaborate special effects
- Final script selection is subject to faculty approval

Proposal Questions

Include written and visual responses to the following questions in your proposal:

- 1. What play are you proposing, and who is the playwright?
- 2. Why this play, and why now?
- 3. What excites you—visually, emotionally, or intellectually—about directing this piece?
- 4. How would you approach casting with regard to inclusion, ensemble storytelling, and the available acting pool at K-State?
- 5. How will you collaborate with your faculty mentor, actors, and design/tech team?
- 6. What will your rehearsal room feel like?
- 7. Are there any scheduling conflicts or major commitments that might affect your availability?
- 8. How do you envision scenic, lighting, costume, and sound design supporting your vision? What design opportunities do you see for your collaborators?
