PROGRAM NOTES

Arundel #11

The Penderwicks books were my favorite books as a young girl and I have always wanted to capture them in music form. This song is trying to capture the mystery of Arundel #11, which is a cottage the Penderwicks stay in. I chose a very strange ensemble for this piece because these instruments properly captured the magic of Arundel in my head!

Hester & Dimmesdale

Also based on a book, this is the first song I ever wrote, which was inspired by *The Scarlet Letter*. I wanted to capture the relationship between Hester and Dimmesdale how I saw it: a tragic, unassuming love. There are things in this music that are abnormal to represent Hester and Dimmesdale's relationship, such as the odd time signature and melody in the viola.

One O'Clock AM

This song is titled with the time at which it was written: one o'clock in the morning. It was for my Music Theory 2 project and it gives you more of my love of pizzicato within strings. It's a pretty basic song in terms of structure with just a simple 4-bar chord progression.

in for three, out for four

Another song set in an odd time signature, this is in 7/8 time and just basically explores sitting in an odd time signature without screaming "I'M NOT IN 4/4 TIME!" This song also lives in an open tonal space to make room for exploration.

Dancing Around Each Other

With this song I wanted to create a fun little waltz to describe through music how flirting feels. There are two "voices" in this song that converse. Try and listen for the story of their relationship!

Tanner's Song

This song is inspired by a small piece my cousin Tanner wrote for her piano lessons to work on the black keys so it has a very pentatonic sound which leaves it feeling open ended. This song is a great example of how my family has nurtured my (our!) love of music!

This song I actually wrote incredibly recently as a tribute to my friend Wyatt Balman. We were close in middle school and high school and he was always an amazing guitar player so this song is in memory of our time together and the joy he constantly radiated. I miss him.

Somewhere or Other

I have always loved jazz so it is only fitting that I write a bit myself! This vocal jazz piece utilizes a very simple chord progression and the words of Christina Rossetti's poem "Somewhere or Other" which had the perfect air of mystery to go with my atmospheric chord progression.

If you came to my junior recital, you heard two pieces from the original musical I have been working on — so here is some more! This is a silly, fun number with the leads and supporting leads where they try to decide on a theme for prom and they all have differing opinions.

Take a Deep Breath
