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Director's Note

The titillating title *In the Next Room, or the vibrator play* features one of its major devises for storytelling (pun intended). Spurred by the 2001 media sensation *The Technology of Orgasm: "Hysteria," the Vibrator, and Women's Sexual Satisfaction* by Rachel P. Maines, Sarah Ruhl's play features a well-intentioned doctor who treats his "hysterical" patients with a vibrator. Set in the mid-1880s before easily accessible pornography and sex-ed classes, this plot allows for misunderstandings and ignorance of the whole of the human body as a place for connection, comfort, and pleasure. Themes of motherhood, marriage and friendship run parallel with casual racism and misogyny in addition to the more obvious human sexuality. At its heart, though, it is about people who are stuck in the cages of societal expectations and limitations and are desperately trying to find themselves through connections with the people around them. While the source book's scholarship was recently called into question, the themes the play centers remain timeless.

In addition to the wonderful acting, technological, and design opportunities, *In the Next Room* is allowing us to practice the recent integration of Consent and Staged Sexual Intimacy procedures into K-State Theatre. Students were fully informed of the production requirements at all points of the process so they could have choice to participate, choice in how they participate, alternatives to those choices if needed at any time, and the ability to opt out at any point has led to a fully collaborative process that stretches all our artistic and personal boundaries without crossing them. Students can take these skills of self-determination and collaboration into any venture they may encounter in the future.

I am immensely proud of our K-State Theatre ensemble as we worked together to create this funny, complicated, heart-wrenching-and-warming production and hope it lifts your spirit and points you towards your own freedoms and connections.

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
