Writer's Notes

Thank God for That is the culmination of the past ten years of my life. Growing up in a conservative evangelical denomination meant that I didn't understand that there could be alternate, progressive interpretations of the Bible verses about homosexuality until I was in my undergrad years. I spent the next several years wrestling with these interpretations and the ones I grew up with, trying to make heads or tails of what God was trying to convey when He allowed those verses to be penned. I had wanted to write a version of this story for years, but ultimately felt that it wasn't my lane to do so. Until it was.

At first, I thought I was just being a good ally, wrestling with these questions, until one night in October 2020, when I realized that I wasn't an ally; I was bisexual. I had been hiding from that reality since my senior year of high school. I spent the next year and a half wrestling with what that meant for me and where I ultimately fell on sexual ethics, more progressive or more conservative.

I wrote this show for all the people like me, who wrestle with God about their queerness, even when He puts their hips out of joint. I also wrote this for those who are comfortable in their answers, in hopes of making them a little more uncomfortable.

While I do fall on a side, my overall stance is this; if you long to belong to God, you do, and no one can take that away from you. As for issues like this, He can work out the rest. He is patient and He has time for your doubts and questions. There is a place for you at His table.

Thank God for that.
