

AGREEMENT

WHEREAS the Board of Regents of the State of Kansas is authorized by Kansas Statutes Annotated 74-3221 to enter into reciprocal agreements with the governing boards of colleges and universities of other countries for purposes of pursuing courses of collegiate, graduate, or professional study; and

WHEREAS the six Board of Regents universities (Emporia State University, Fort Hays State University, Kansas State University, Pittsburg State University, University of Kansas, and Wichita State University) and The Kansas Technical Institute desire to enter into an agreement with the Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay; and

WHEREAS the Board of Regents of the State of Kansas, the seven Board of Regents institutions, and the Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay, expressly state that they shall benefit from such a reciprocal agreement; and

NOW THEREFORE; in consideration of the foregoing recitals and the following covenants the parties, intending to be mutually bound thereby, agree as follows:


1. The seven Board of Regents institutions and the Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay; shall:
 - a. Establish a program of cultural exchange, with the purpose of stimulating and improving academic, administrative, research, and public service activities of the institutions named;

- b. Promote agreements to stimulate the exchange of professors and students, specifically:
 - i. Each of the Board of Regents institutions agrees to accept up to 12 (twelve) Paraguayan students who are graduates of duly accredited secondary schools, who meet the admission requirements of the Board of Regents institutions, and who are recommended by officials of the Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay. The Paraguayan students will pay the same tuition as residents of Kansas.
 - ii. The Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay agrees to extend facilities to 12 (twelve) certified students of each of the Board of Regents institutions. These students may enroll in classes or engage in scientific research and will be granted tuition reduction on the same basis as Paraguayan students in Kansas.
2. This agreement may be cancelled effective not more than one year after notice in writing is given by the State Board of Regents to the representatives of the Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay, or by notice under the same conditions from the Catholic University Our Lady of Asunción, Paraguay, to the Board of Regents of the State of Kansas.
