

Phi Kappa Phi

The Honor Society of Phi Kappa Phi was founded in 1897 at the University of Maine to recognize scholarship of students in all branches of learning. At a meeting of the presidents of Land Grant Colleges in 1900 it became a national society with the first three chapters being at the University of Maine, the University of Tennessee, and Pennsylvania State University. The three gold stars on the badge of the society signify the three original chapters. The Kansas State Chapter was founded in 1915 and was the fourteenth Phi Kappa Phi chapter organized. The society now has over 300 chapters and has inducted over 1,000,000 scholars.

The motto of the society, *Philosophia Krateito Photon*, means "Let the love of learning rule humanity." The insignia - a globe surrounded by rays of light - is symbolic of the equality of all branches of learning in the pursuit of truth. It recognizes the interdependence in the modern world of all forms of knowledge and the necessity of cooperation and coordination of many diverse arts and sciences in the extending of boundaries of knowledge and applying this knowledge to the solution of human problems.

Phi Kappa Phi was established, as stated by the National Constitution, "to provide an honor society dedicated to the Unity and Democracy of Education and open to honor students from all departments of American universities and colleges." At Kansas State University this purpose is attained chiefly by electing to membership junior and senior undergraduate and graduate students who have distinguished themselves in academic pursuits as evidenced by high grade averages, and a limited number of faculty who have attained positions of distinction in their fields. To be eligible for election, juniors must have completed at least seventy-two credit hours and rank scholastically in the top 7.5 percent of their class. Seniors and graduate students must rank in the top 10 percent of their class.
