Two Objections to a Dialetheic Solution to the Semantic Paradoxes

In my experience, the two most common objections to a dialetheic solution to the semantic paradoxes (other than a blanket rejection of dialetheism) concern (a) Curry's paradox, and (b) the "truth-only" problem. I find neither of these persuasive. In this talk I will explain why.

Graham Priest is Distinguished Professor of Philosophy at The Graduate Center, City University of New York, Boyce Gibson Professor Emeritus at the University of Melbourne, and International Research Fellow at the Ruhr University of Bochum. He is known for his work on nonclassical logic, metaphysics, the history of philosophy, and Buddhist philosophy. He has published over 300 articles—in nearly every major philosophy and logic journal—and eight books, including *In Contradiction* and *The Fifth Corner of Four: An Essay on Buddhist Metaphysics and the Catuskoti*.
