Yale, USC, Notre Dame, UNC-Chapel Hill, and Ohio State University have recently hosted the annual PSS meeting. Selection as host is prestigious and is an indicator of the research visibility of both individual faculty and the department as a whole. I led the department’s efforts to secure K-State’s selection as host.

## **GRADUATE PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT**

MA and PhD in Security Studies, Kansas State University

Developed the political science curriculum for the MA and PhD programs in Security Studies at Kansas State University. The programs are interdisciplinary, centering on collaboration between KSU Departments of History and Political Science. Both the MA and PhD were designed to teach a mix of traditional students and faculty, staff, and students at the US Army's Command and General Staff College (Ft. Leavenworth, KS). Over 400 graduate students have entered the programs combined since their development. Over \$8 million in federal funding was secured to support the initial development of the MA and the PhD.

3+1+2 Partnership with Beijing Information Science and Technology University (BISTU)

Spearheaded unique partnership with Chinese university to allow BISTU students to transfer to KSU in their fourth undergraduate year before entering KSU's MPA program. Accepted students earn their undergraduate degrees from BISTU, which accepts KSU courses as transfer credit. Students then progress into the KSU MPA with the experience of already having had one year of university education in the US. Agreement signed in 2017.
