# MIDDLE EAST STUDIES MINOR



Increases your knowledge of this critical region on campus and beyond while making a valuable addition to your degree. The Middle East Studies minor is housed in the Department of Political Science and involves five departments across the campus including; Political Science, History, Communication Studies, Philosophy, and Modern Languages.

### REQUIREMENTS

The minor requires 20 credit hours (3 introductory course credits, 8 language course credits, 9 core course credits and 3 elective course credits [optional]) to complete. It is required that students maintain a good academic standing with a grade of C or above in these courses.

It is strongly recommended that students also take additional courses in language (e.g. ARAB 300 and ARAB 301) for a complete cultural immersion in the Middle Eastern culture.

A student may substitute previous college level course work in Turkish, Persian, or Hebrew upon approval. A native speaker of these languages may be exempt from the language requirements. A student may also fulfill language requirements in a study abroad program if these courses are approved by Kansas State University.
