The conference preceding KSU was hosted by the University of Texas Austin and the University of Michigan Ann Arbor will host the year after KSU. Yale, Emory, Rice, Notre Dame, USC, Ohio State University and the University of Iowa have recently hosted the annual PSS meeting. Selection as host is prestigious, and is an indicator of the department's research visibility in the field.

GRADUATE PROGRAM DEVELOPMENT

MA and PhD in Security Studies, Kansas State University

One of the principal political scientists involved in creating the MA and PhD programs in Security Studies at Kansas State University. The programs are interdisciplinary, centering on collaboration between KSU Departments of History and Political Science. Both programs were designed to teach a mix of traditional students and faculty, staff, and students at the US Army's Command and General Staff College (Ft. Leavenworth, KS). Over 350 graduate students have entered the programs combined since their development. Over \$8 million in federal funding was secured to support the initial development of the MA and the PhD.

3+1+2 Partnership with Beijing Information Science and Technology University (BISTU)

Spearheaded unique partnership with Chinese university to allow BISTU students to transfer to KSU in their fourth undergraduate year before entering KSU's MPA program. Accepted students will earn their undergraduate degrees from BISTU, which will accept KSU courses as transfer credit. They will then progress into the KSU MPA with the experience of already having had one year of US university education. Agreement signed in 2017. The first students will matriculate in 2019.
