A Western heritage course and a literary/rhetorical arts course both overlay well with required English courses.*

Admissions requirements

- Be admitted for the summer or fall term.
- Submit a program application at k-state.edu/prelaw/lead.
- Have a minimum high school 3.5 GPA on a 4.0 unweighted scale.
- Have an ACT score of at least 26, or an SAT of at least 1170.

Application timeline

- Feb. 1: Priority deadline to apply.
- March 1: Priority deadline to file the FAFSA.
- Early March: Program committee will review qualified applications.
- Mid-March: Applicants will be notified of admissions decisions by mail.
