MUSEUM STUDIES CERTIFICATE

Museums are integral to educating the public about a variety of topics that expand from art and creative endeavors to natural and human history, as well as anthropological topics and sciences. The certificate in Museum Studies at Kansas State University is valuable to those who are considering a career in a museum or other institutions that seek to educate the public through interpretation, exhibition, and curation of material objects.



Getting Started

Declare your intent to complete the certificate by filling out the appropriate form in the SASW Department office (204 Waters Hall) by contacting one of our advisors (Gabriel Bachura <u>gbachura@ksu.edu</u>; or David Ollington dollingt@ksu.edu).

How it Works

Complete 15 credit hours of approved core and elective courses earning a cumulative GPA of 2.0 or higher in the certificate courses.

Of the 15 credit hours, 9 must be completed in core courses in Museums and collections, and 6 credits hours may be drawn from additional complementary core or elective courses. Courses must be taken in at least two departments to ensure programmatic breadth.

An internship in a museum or similar institution is highly recommended and can be completed for credit and applied to this certificate. The internship must be approved by a member of the core faculty for this certificate.
