Dear Alumni Brothers:

It was great to see many of you this fall at the house. Since then, I have had an opportunity to visit with the active membership, the national fraternity and many of you alumni brothers about addressing the great need for improvements to the chapter house. We need to bring the house up to the current standard of a modern student residential facility if we expect Beta Kappa to continue on the K-State campus.

First of all, you should know that the actives have taken steps recently to insure that the membership body is sound and accepting of the values of Sigma Nu. There is a renewed commitment to these values, along with the importance of scholarship and service to the fraternity, the university and the community at large. Recently, several alumni have endowed a scholarship fund for Beta Kappa through the Kansas State University Foundation, the Sigma Nu Excellence Fund. We are developing a much stronger working relationship between the active and alumni, to support and mentor our collegiate brothers as they pursue their educational goals as a member of Sigma Nu.

Secondly, the house will soon be 75 years old and just like any building, it must be updated and maintained. The present condition is not acceptable to anyone whether they are prospective members, parents, actives, or alumni. We cannot compete for quality members if living conditions are not up to par. This being the case, we will begin a major fund raising campaign during the next few months to completely remodel and update the house into a modern collegiate residential facility.

Although we are not officially underway with fund raising, you can never start too early, particularly with a project as large as this one. As we are at year end and tax planning is on our minds, I would strongly encourage you to make a tax deductible donation to this building campaign. Many of us have employer gift matching plans so don't forget to leverage your gift if possible.
