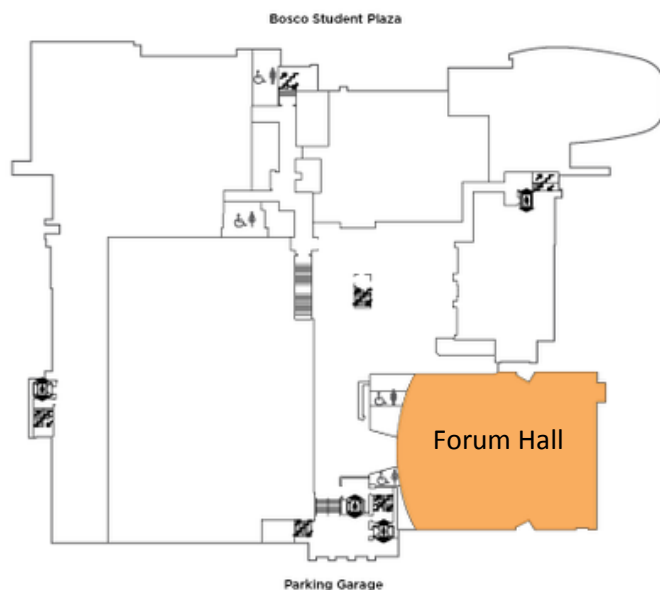


About Dr. Todd Zakrajsek
