Active Shooter Training

On March 06, 2025, cadets in Detachment 270 had the opportunity to participate in an Active Violence Training session led by the Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI). The training was designed to equip cadets with the skills and knowledge necessary to respond effectively to high-pressure, violent situations. KBI provided a briefing on how to respond effectively during an active violence situation. KBI emphasized the key strategy of ALICE - Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter and Evacuate - to enhance safety and preparedness during these situations.

After the KBI briefing, cadets participated in realistic, hands-on simulations, which gave them an opportunity to apply the strategies they learned to identify potential threats, maintain composure during a crisis, and take quick, decisive actions to in uncertain circumstances. Additionally, cadets applied first aid techniques during simulated scenarios, reinforcing the importance of providing immediate care in emergency situations.

This experience not only emphasized the need for preparation in unforeseen challenges but also gave cadets a greater sense of confidence and readiness when faced with difficult circumstances.

Cadets Selected for Summer Field Training

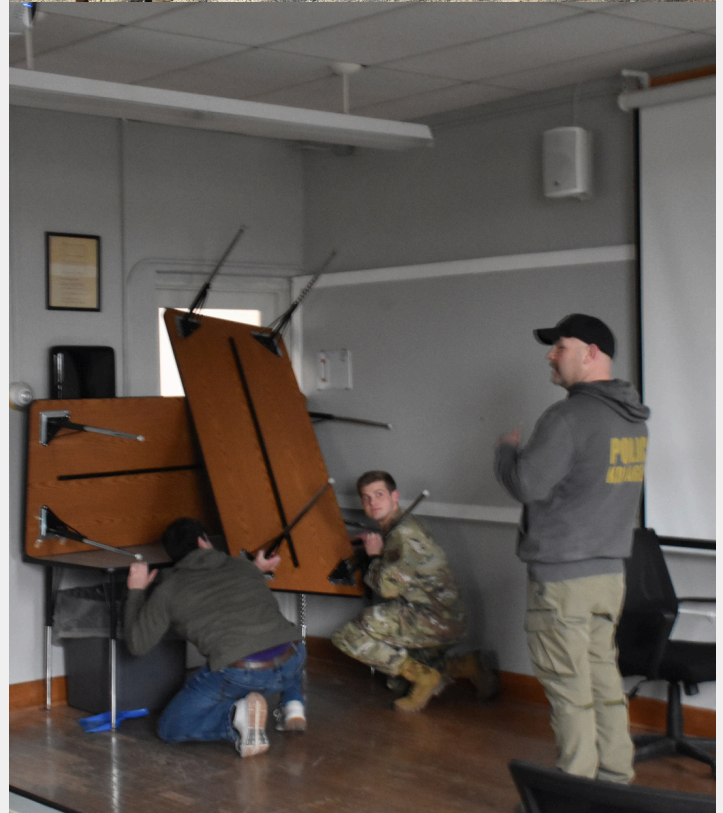
