Volunteers for programs are asked to set aside at least 1 hour per week to spend with their conversational partner, but it would be ideal if 2 hours were the minimum. Actual meeting times are flexible according to you and your partner's schedule. This program is intended to be fun, so do anything that is fun and that stimulates conversation. They are looking for volunteers of all adult ages due to the various ages of the students.
